

Good news: You have gifts to give.

TOLI clients are not charity cases. They are women and men who want to provide for their families and their communities. They don't want handouts, they want to be providers. And their ideas, skills, and gifts are powerful assets ready to be unleashed so they can achieve their dreams of a better life.

TOLI clients are bakers, seamstresses, farmers, and caregivers. They're artists, salespeople, plumbers, and barbers.

Through TOLI's Business Basics Course, one-on-one coaching, and small group experiences, TOLI clients see — sometimes for the first time — that they are not just 'someone in need,' but someone with gifts to give. Someone who can make a difference.



Good news: Change is possible.

We are not a bank. Yes, providing access to small loans is TOLI's main service. But our program yeilds much more than economic transformation. Clients join our program to make a change in their life, but they're often surprised at the scope of that change.

Through training, support, new community, and yes, access to capital on terms they can afford, TOLI clients see change in their income, but also improvement in their household stability and security, in their kids' education, in their sense of belonging, in their hope for the future.

GROWING THE CHURCH

Through a unique joint project with the Presbyterian Church of East Africa and The Outreach Foundation, **TOLI provided funding to build a new church** in Kiandutu slum, a TOLI community in Kenya. In its first few months of existence, the new church — called PCEA Kianjau Church (right) — already had more than 100 new members, a thriving youth program, and plans to expand. Many new members are TOLI clients. The church now serves as a hub for TOLI activity in the area and a gathering place for the TOLI community in Kiandutu.

"Touch of Love" began in California as a personal ministry of Hoda Mansour, the mother of Dr. Emad Eddie Yassa, in the late 90s. Through it she provided clothes, furniture, and services to refugees in her community, to show a "touch of love" from God.

Since then, TOLI has walked alongside thousands of poor men and women who dream of providing for their own families. In partnership Later, after a life-changing trip to his native Egypt in the early 2000s, with local ministries, TOLI has brought hope, transformation, and the Emad felt God stir his heart in a new way toward the poor. Heartbroken life-saving power of the Gospel to families and communities in some of by the poverty he saw in Egypt's villages, he returned to the US feeling the toughest places in the world. It hasn't always been easy, but even called to do something about it. Something sustainable, something lifethrough hard lessons and setbacks, God has been faithful and given giving, something built on God's love for each person, no matter their grace upon grace. Today, TOLI operates in partnership with five key local circumstances. Emad began focusing on the simple but powerful concept ministry partners, in 26 sites, across five countries around the world.



> PROGRAM expenses are invested in direct partner support for our microloan program, such as loan capital, grants for field staff salaries, medical program donations, business training, accountability visits and monitoring, and program staff costs.

> ADMINISTRATION expenses are invested in operational support, including accounting, bank services, information technology, and communications.

> FUNDRAISING expenses are invested in telling others about how God is at work through TOLI, inviting others to join us in this kingdom work, and sharing stories of transformation through TOLI around the world.

100% OF OVERHEAD COSTS COVERED BY SPONSORS

This year, \$58,938 of administration and fundraising costs were covered through generous donations from sponsors. **That means every donor dollar was directly invested in programming.**

\$25,603 CONTRIBUTED IN-COUNTRY DIRECT TO LOCAL PARTNER

Local donors in Egypt financially support TOLI through our partner, Heliopolis Evangelical Church. All local donations in Egypt are restricted for TOLI program expenses only. This amount is in addition to US-based revenue shown in Financial Statements.





Restoring human dignity through microloans

- TOLI provides **microloans**, **business training and Christian discipleship** in poor communities.
- Microloans are a hand up, helping families build small businesses to provide for their households.
- The average microloan is just **\$252**.
- Clients pay back the loan, which is then loaned to someone else in the same community, so each donor dollar gets used again and again.
- **Steady income** means families eat better, kids go to school, households stabilize, communities get stronger.
- We partner with local **ministries who point to the grace of Jesus Christ** at every turn, fostering spiritual growth through relationships with staff and the local church.
